A program that provides **group support sessions and case management** to African-American women 18 years or older and up to 30 weeks pregnant at the time of enrollment.

Each session explores pregnancy and parenting from a women's health perspective, and the topics covered include:

- Cultural heritage
- Healthy pregnancies, labor and delivery
- · Prenatal, postnatal, newborn care
- Stress management
- · Healthy relationships

Participants also receive **guidance and referrals** on a range of topics, including health insurance application assistance and family planning counseling.
